## SUBSTANCE

- What is the <u>range of choreographic totality</u> including form (either as a focus or as part of a larger form) while maintaining unity with other parts of the unit? What is the range of the use of body and equipment with respect to styles, expression, idioms, etc.? <u>consider</u> <u>the range as the sum of the events in all areas including staging</u> <u>and other design choices</u>.
- How does the color guard <u>complement the overall design and</u> <u>concept of the program</u>?
- What is the <u>depth and variety of technical and expressive</u> <u>components (including the range of expressive components of</u> <u>time, space, etc.)</u>?
- To what extent does the color guard <u>enhance the musical</u> <u>structure</u>?
- · What is the extent of simultaneous and/or layered responsibilities?
- What is the range of musical, physical and environmental challenges?

## ACHIEVEMENT

- How clearly do the performers collectively and individually
  <u>demonstrate and sustain</u> quality of training?
- Is there a <u>significant level of achievement</u> -- of the challenges of the choreographic totality?
- Do the performers <u>deliver and sustain</u> a significant level of achievement? Consider their challenges of both a technical and expressive nature and how well they handle them.
- How *precise* are the performers including starts, stops, body work, expression, etc., over the full substance of their responsibilities?
- How do the performers respond to the <u>overall environmental</u> <u>challenges</u> of time, space and general conditions of the stage?
- Do the performers <u>deliver and sustain</u> a strong level of concentration and stamina throughout the program? Do they <u>recover</u> quickly and with understanding when the need arises?
